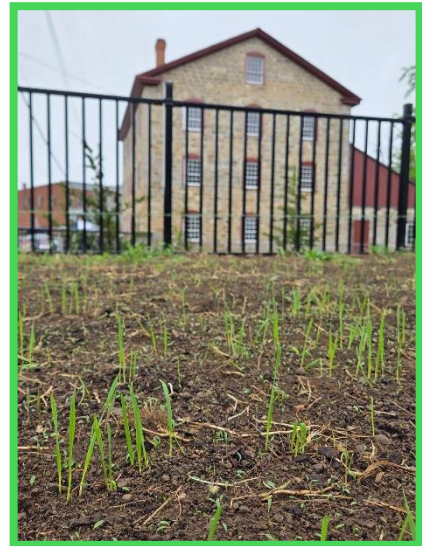

The Old Stone Mill is now open seven days a week for tours between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. until Labour Day. Four summer mill interpretive staff will be happy to provide a tour or sell some cold stone ground heritage Red Fife flour. Admission is free with donations being greatly appreciated. Milling demonstrations are scheduled every two weeks; a complete milling schedule is available on the website at [www.deltamill.org](http://www.deltamill.org). Notices are also posted in advance on Facebook.

A new exhibit of heritage Red Fife wheat growing on the Russell Greenspace by the bridge is coming along nicely. Local farmer and miller, Chris Wooding, rototilled the area and planted the wheat. It is hopeful that a waving field of wheat will be ready by early fall. Office and Collections Manager, Rebecca Rothwell, is maintaining and weeding the field. Even a local snapping turtle came to look at the Red Fife wheat. After a quick visit, she found the soil unsuitable for building a nest, so she moved to another location.

A new exhibit is being created to replace the current 3<sup>rd</sup> floor Mills & Stills display. This exhibit will feature beautifully enhanced and colourized historic images of the mill on one wall with mill restoration photos on the opposite wall. The pristine condition of today's mill was made possible by restoration work which totalled more than \$2 million dollars. This is a 'big story' that is being told in the Society's newsletter and on the website.

Those people passing by the Old Town Hall will have noticed a new addition, a beautiful gable. This work rectified issues with snow and rain coming off the main and porch roofs onto the entrance steps. While ugly snow guards and a larger gutter would have solved the problem, the Board decided that a gable roof would be more visually appealing as it also added heritage character to the Old Town Hall. This was a project over a year in the making due to the difficulty in finding a contractor, but the job has now been completed. Discussions are now ongoing as to the best way to create signage showcasing "Old Town Hall, The Delta Mill Society".





Maintenance of the Old Stone Mill is a never-ending task with wooden sill rot being the current issue. Work on the lower floor sills began last fall but unfortunately, the onset of winter stopped the process. Stabilization and repair work on the wooden sills has resumed.

Volunteers are presently making plans for participation in the 2025 **Delta Fair Parade** on July 27<sup>th</sup>. Joan Delaney, who is the newest member of the Delta Mill Society, is coordinating the parade entry which will feature the summer students. Joan has a lot of good ideas, and she has been busy getting the students enthused about their participation. Last year's summer students thoroughly enjoyed riding in the parade.



### **Blacksmithing Demonstrations**

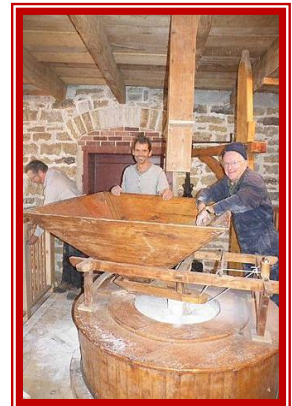
July 26<sup>th</sup> and August 16<sup>th</sup>

The 200-year-old mill stones in the Old Stone Mill will start turning at 1:00 p.m. as they grind heritage wheat into flour. Come on out and see how top-quality flour is made. Admission is free but donations are always appreciated.

As part of the **Doors Open Rideau Lakes** program, the Old Stone Mill, the Old Town Hall and the Blacksmith Shop will be open on August 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. In addition to the blacksmithing and milling demonstrations on Saturday, beautiful quilt crafted by the Stone Bridge Quilters will be on display in the mill. Director Katherine Killins is organizing the display which will showcase quilts throughout the mill. It promises to be a “must see” exhibition. The quilts will be on display on both Saturday and Sunday.

Director Liz Priebe is organizing a Makers Market in the Old Town Hall which will feature different types of crafters showing how they create their products with some being available for sale. Makers of quilts, pottery, soap, preserves, jewelry, home décor and stained glass will be in attendance on August 16<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

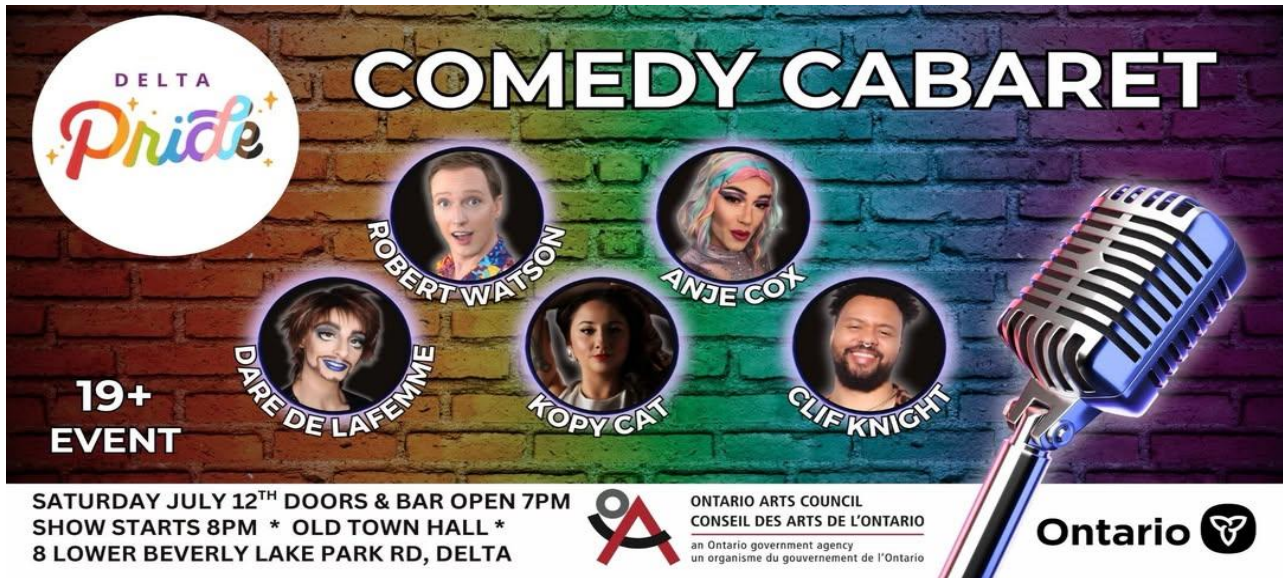


## Delta Pride is Back for its 4<sup>th</sup> Year !

## FIRE SAFETY TIPS

*Starting your grill for the first time this year?* Make sure all burner ports are free of rust or dirt and that the burner orifice is clear of dust and cobwebs. Check cylinder connections and hoses for leaks by brushing a 50/50 mix of liquid soap and water onto all connections and hoses. Rising bubbles when you turn on the valve indicate a leak. Tighten connections or repair the hose until there are no bubbles.
