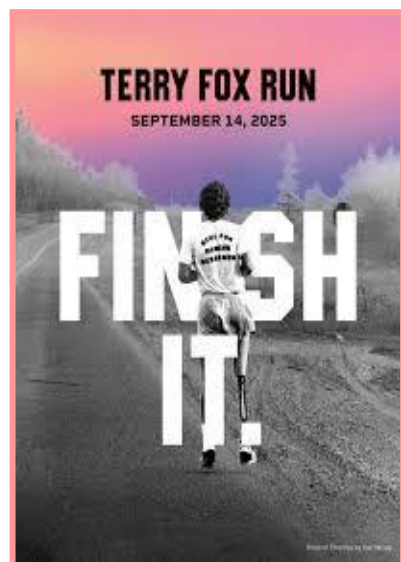

As in past years, each of the summer students learned how to operate the millstones under the direction of Miller Chris Wooding. This is a unique hands-on heritage experience that is provided annually to the students.

## CHARGING? BE BATTERY SMART. TAKE A TIP.

LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES store a lot of energy in a small place. These batteries can overheat, start a fire, or explode if overcharged or damaged. By learning how to **BUY**, **CHARGE**, and **RECYCLE** these batteries safely, you can help prevent a fire in your home.



**BUY** only listed products. When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.



**STOP** using your device right away if the battery smells weird, gets too hot, makes popping noises, changes in shape or color. If it is safe, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call **9-1-1**.



**CHARGE** devices safely. Always use the cables that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved.



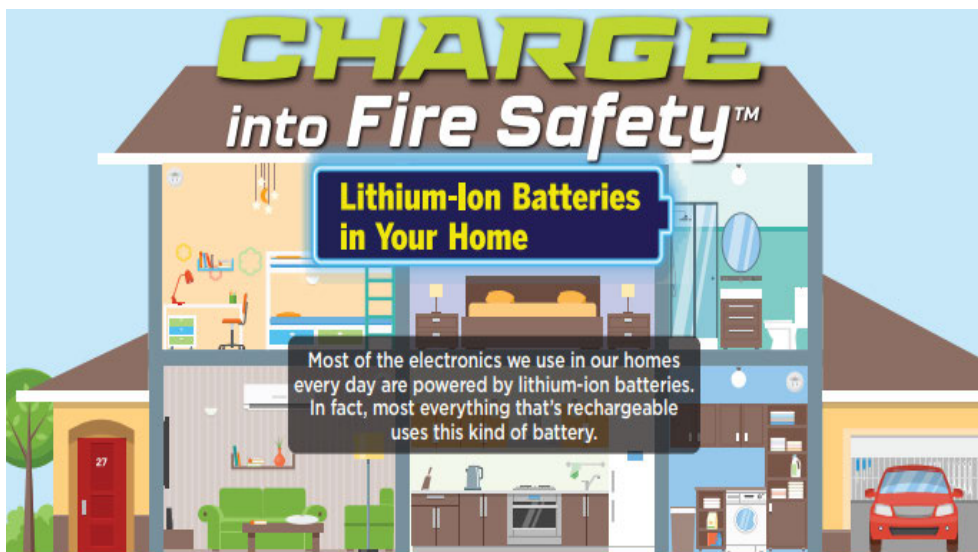
**RECYCLE** batteries responsibly. Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire.



**CHARGE** your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.

## ❖ A BALANCED BUDGET

Council passed the 2025 Operating and Capital budget at a 5.78% tax rate increase. The Ontario Municipal Act requires municipal Councils to annually adopt a balanced budget. Historically, the Township has used borrowing to achieve this; however, 2025 is the first year since 2018 that Council has approved a balanced budget without the use of borrowing for operations and in-year capital purchases. Assisting in the new revenues was the net assessment growth of \$34,653,488 or 1.38%.

## ❖ BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The following are some of the key projects included in the 2025 budget: the demolition of the former Delta Maple Syrup Factory, the Ward 3 By-election, delivering \$177,615 in community grants, continuation of the septic inspection program, micro-surfacing of Big Rideau Lakes Road, 50% cost share of the Townline bridge with Elizabethtown-Kitley, financing to build Fire Station 2 and the Portland Hall and Library, the purchase of equipment such as a plow and sander, grader, fire pumper, fire boat as well as 37 kms of single surfacing for numerous township roads.

## ❖ DELTA FLOODING

The Village of Delta has experienced ongoing flooding which has occurred 22 times in 37 years between 1980 and 2017. The Township has been tirelessly advocating to resolve this matter through correspondence and meetings with the province.

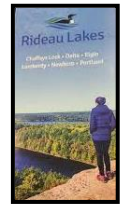
In 2024, the Ministry of Natural Resources and the Township partnered with the Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority and contributed \$20K to a Delta Flood Mitigation Study conducted by Jewell Engineering. The final study document cited three mitigation options that could achieve meaningful improvements to the control of flooding in Delta with the fastest and most cost-efficient measure being the lowering of the Winter Stoplog Setting of the dam that is owned and operated by the Ministry. The study has been sent to Minister Mike Harris asking the Minister to implement the recommendations.

Councillor Joan Delaney resigned from her position as Councillor for the Ward of South Crosby on March 4, 2025. A by-election was held on June 26, 2025.

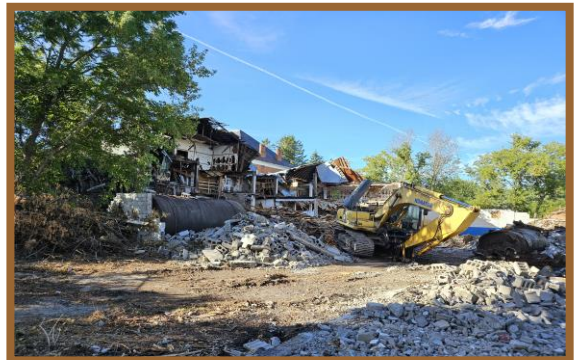
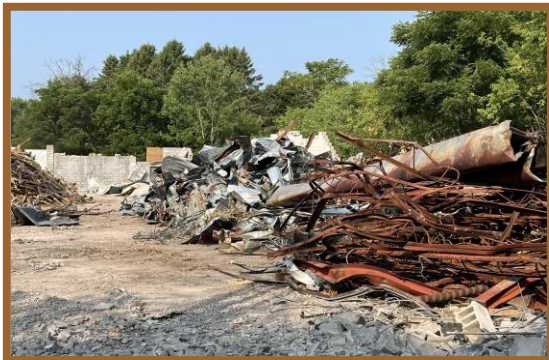
Council and Staff wish to thank Joan for her years of service on Council and wish her the best in her future endeavors.

## ❖ DELTA MAPLE SYRUP FACTORY DEMOLITION

Council awarded the demolition of the Delta Maple Syrup Factory to Fast Eddie's Auto Recycling in the amount of \$102,259.00. The contract included all labour, materials, and equipment necessary to demolish and remove the former structure and provide a soil cap. The contractor was also responsible for the abatement of all designated substances prior to the demolition of the building. Cambium inspected the site after removal of the designated substances at a cost of \$2,000 to the Township.
